From the Desk of AnnE

Dear Friends,

To me November 2018 is "Congregation Appreciation" Month. Why?

I am aware of your care, support and prayers. This October was *Clergy Appreciation Month*. Your kind words, prayers and surprises reminded me how true that is -- thank you! Thank you for your care to both Joel and I. We constantly are reminded that we have a 'church home'.

On **Reformation Sunday** I included the following in my sermon -- "There is no such thing as a solitary Christian." Today I add to that by noting that no pastor can serve in a congregation alone. Ministry is shared with a faith community. I recognize we are colleagues and partners in ministry.

An example of this was when I truly needed extra help. I was given the gift of these words, "Pastor, don't you worry about a thing. Everything is going to be all right."

Please know I experience God through you. I experience God through the perseverance that you all model for me.

- Through the mercy and forgiveness that you show me.
- Through seeing your trust in the abundance of God.
- Through your faith in life and faith through death.

You teach me how God works in our world. And...without a community of faith - I would be lost.

So this month...know how much I appreciate you.

"When I pray for you, my heart is full of joy...How natural it is that I should feel as I do about you, for you have a very special place in my heart." Philippians 1:4,7a (Living New Testament paraphrased)

May the peace of Christ be with you all.

Are you up for the challenge?

Remember the Reformation SUNDAY Worship? You were challenged. The challenge 'for you' is to speak the gospel, the heart of our faith, in ten words or less. Ten words or less. One phrase that is the heart of the good news of Jesus Christ for you.

Now, as you are thinking about it, remember that all theology is lived theology. In other words, what we know about God helps us make sense of the world as it actually exists. Your theology might sound good. Say, for example, "Jesus died for my sins." But if you have no idea of what that means, and it doesn't bring meaning to your own experience, it is not the good news for you.



We all have different experiences. We all see God differently. And that brings richness to our proclamation. Together - we come to know God. Together - we experience the good news of Jesus Christ in many lives, and share that richness of what we believe. Which is simply to say, "Don't cheat." You can't copy off your neighbour. The challenge is, "What is the good news for you?"

Can you do it? I know you can. Leave your ten words or less in my church mailbox. (Your choice whether you put your name on the paper.)

Enjoy your process!



November 2018 Message for Congregations and Lay and Rostered Leaders

Dear Beloved of God -

We have just concluded the season of Area Gatherings: Northern (Sept. 28-29 at Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd, Stony Plain in collaboration with St. John Lutheran of Golden Spike, Spruce Grove and St. Matthew, Spruce Grove), Southwestern (Oct. 13 at First Lutheran, Calgary), Southern (Oct. 13 at Spirit of Grace Lutheran, Brooks via video report and telephone Q&A) and East and West Central (Oct 20 at Zion Lutheran, Bashaw).

Thank you to the Area Leadership Teams for your preparation for and planning of the Area Gatherings. I value these times when we have the opportunity to gather together as God's people for worship, learning, conversation and feasting.

This year we gathered under the theme: "Faith, Hope and Love" which was an extension of our Synod Convention theme and conversation from I Cor. 13. For our Dwelling in the Word we spent time together considering the text of I Thess. 1:2-3: We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Participants shared in part of the need to see ourselves as "we", as community together; conversation centered around how a spirit of gratefulness might impact our faith community and neighborhood; and of the work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope which they see.

Then most gatherings viewed a brief video (The Synod Convention Interview - All Questions) prepared during the Synod Convention around faith, hope and love. Much of the rest of our time was spent in conversation around how we might work collaboratively within our Areas and across our Synod in faith, hope and love.

I look forward in the next couple of months to meet with each Area Leadership Team for further conversation, listening and discernment together as we move forward always giving thanks...constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.

The Synod of Alberta and the Territories convention was held June 14 to 16 in Camrose. Pastor AnnE, Keith Scheidt and Pastor Doug Giles represented Lakeland Lutheran. The following are convention highlights:

Larry Kochendorfer was re-elected as Bishop for a six year term on the first ballot. Synod Council members were elected.

Delegates were elected for the July 2019 National Convention in Regina. Pastor AnnE was elected as a lay delegate for the northern area.

The Synod of Alberta and the Territories renewed its covenant with The Evangelical Church of Columbia.

The guest speaker Dr. Anna Madsen provided inspiring and thought provoking talks on Faith, Hope and Love.






Coffee and a Concert.


HONOURING 100 YEARS OF ARMISTICE
