#### October 2023 Message for Congregations and Lay and Rostered Leaders




Dear Beloved of God -

"Mission relationships cannot be made warm in the microwave of quick encounters," Rev. Natanael Lizarazo shared with our Synod Delegation during our journey to our Companion Partner, The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Colombia (IELCO), this past summer.

Our journey was an opportunity to experience, embrace, and engage the contexts and ministries of IELCO; to build relationships (and to re-connect) with our siblings in Christ in Colombia; and to seek an expanding global understanding of faithful discipleship through the Colombian Lutheran context.

The journey itself deepened relationships and the on-going connection between IELCO and our Synod and was anything but a "quick encounter." It reflected our mutual accompaniment.



Rev. Lizarazo wrote: You may ask what difference the mission engagement of the Synod of Alberta and The Territories makes in Colombia given the magnitude of such an overwhelming situation. My friends, the difference is real, it is a healing difference, a difference which is greatly celebrated and appreciated. Like the story of the starfish dying on the beach, we cannot simply be overwhelmed by the numbers to the point we become immobilized to act in the

tangible ways God leads us. As Mother Theresa says, "we can indeed be moved to do small things with great love." In the end, this is what really matters. Thank you indeed for walking alongside with us in God's mission. Our beloved sisters and brothers in the Good Shepherd in Soacha (a senior's ministry supported by our Synod) are a living testimony; though they have lost everything materially speaking, they are still spiritually rich in faith, hope and gratitude! These spiritual realities are indeed fruitful seeds for the healing and transformation of Colombia.

Thank you to all who prayerfully accompanied our Synod Delegation. Thank you to the delegation participants for an openness to experience, embrace and engage. Thank you to IELCO for the welcome, hospitality, love and prayers.

"Gratitude is the memory of the heart," shared Rev. Lizarazo. As I continue to journey and to reflect upon our Delegation's experience, I find myself speechless with gratitude.





#### Lesley's Farewell ... It Began with a Dream.

want to go there! I wonder who lives there," I dreamed when I first flew high over the Arctic while moving to northern Alberta in 1978. Little did I know then that this was the seed of God's call to northern ministry.

In 2004, On Eagle's Wings had a dream too, a dream to expand the five year-old, Yellowknife based ministry to northern Alberta and Saskatchewan.

Our dreams converged in 2005 when, as a newly ordained deacon, I was called to serve as On Eagle's Wings' first Pastor for Northern Alberta and Saskatchewan. It was an exciting time for people in remote communities, for On Eagle's Wings, and for me. Not many new ordinands are given a plane, a crew of volunteer pilots, and are told to "go out and build a ministry among the people!"

The element of adventure and vision of working ecumenically with a focus on building trusting relationships were exciting. Trust would be the foundation through which we could share Jesus' love by Word and presence.

alongside northern people reflected the work of the Holy Spirit as comforter and guide; we walked together as they discovered God's call and vision for their own lives and communities.

Ministry of Word and presence continues, even as the details of how we walk with northern people have changed as new needs have emerged. Women have been empowered to become leaders in the church. Children continue to receive a strong foundation in faith. Now we are reaching out to youth and their leaders with resources for discipleship and mental health.

As my time with On Eagle's Wings ends, what remains unchanged is God's dream for His Kingdom in the North. I am thrilled that Robin has accepted God's invitation to share in His dream for the North and to lead On Eagle's Wings into the next stage of making it a reality.
